The past year has been a very busy one for the UGRA. In May, we hosted the CURAC Conference (College & University Retiree Associations of Canada). We had 66 registrants, coming from every province except for PEI. The feedback from the participants showed us that it was a resounding success. They were very impressed with the beautiful campus, quality of service and food served. We had eight presentations over the three days by current faculty. Our thanks to the University for all it does to keep us connected and for all the assistance from Alumni Affairs & Development and Conference Services in helping make the CURAC Conference such a success. Most important, a big thank you to Janet Kaufman for her excellent leadership in making the conference happen – thank you Janet!

In August, President Vaccarino hosted the UGRA Retirees Social in the JT Powell building. Daniel Atlin, VP-External welcomed everyone and offered the University's thanks to the retirees for their ongoing support and to congratulate us for donating the most of any other U of G community to the 2018 United Way campaign. Refreshments were served and we were given a tour of the JT Powell building and its upgrades. There is also a peer-to-peer counselling area which provides students with a safe haven to receive support.

In June, Dr. Malcolm Campbell, VP-Research was our keynote speaker at our AGM and he talked about U of G being rated #1 nationally for both corporate and not-for-profit research. He also reported on the opening of the new beef that can accommodate 200 cows, a dairy facility for 200 cows and the new Turfgrass Institute, which should be opening soon.

Looking forward, we have our upcoming trip to China in October. Thirty-two members will travel to see many sights, including the Great Wall, Forbidden City, Terra Cotta Warriors, Panda House and much more. We will share some pictures and stories upon our return. We






2019 UGRA Scholarship Recipient

The Bean Study

Adults (≥18 years) with elevated LDL cholesterol (3-5 mmol/L) are needed for a nutrition study to examine the cholesterol-lowering effects of beans.



This study will involve:

- 1 screening phone call (5-10 min)
- 1 screening study visit (30-45 min; includes LDL cholesterol test)
- 1 study orientation (30-45 min)
- Three 4-week treatment periods (details on the right)

Each 4-week treatment period will involve:

- Three study visits (30-45 min)
- o Body measurements (start, middle and end)
- Fasting blood sample and fecal sample (start and end)
- 3-day food record (once in the middle)
- Appetite and tolerance survey (5 days on 3 occasions)
- Study treatment consumption log (every day)

Financial Compensation Provided

This study is being conducted by the Department of Human Health and Nutritional Sciences and has received clearance from the University of Guelph Human Research Ethics Board (REB#18-10-045).
