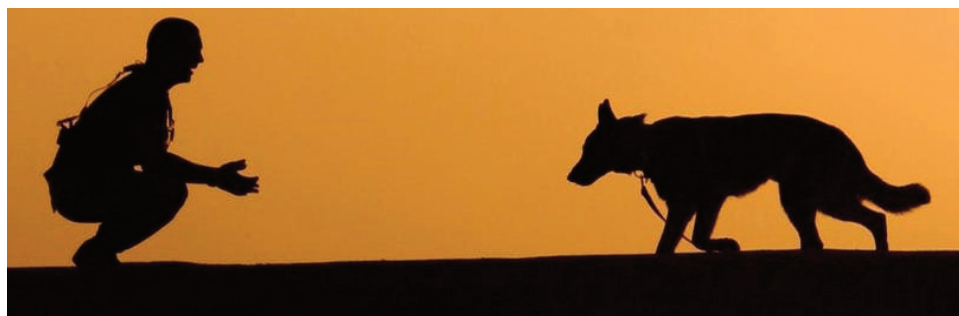

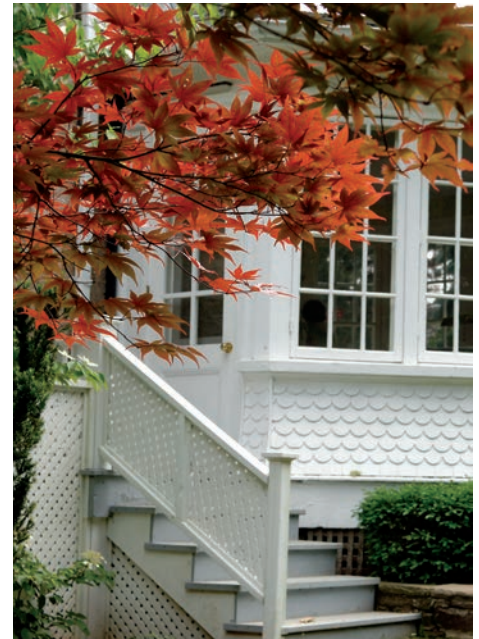

UofG President's Social

On August 29 a good number of UGRA members met at McLaughlin Library to enjoy some time with each other, indulge in some delightful refreshments, and to hear a presentation by Franco Vaccarino, the university's recently reappointed President and host of the occasion. He spoke on the university's current Strategic Framework and its "Path Forward." Of special importance to him are themes of Internationalization and Sustainability. Practical emphasis is also given to Diversity and Inclusion. Readers may be familiar with the university's slogan "To Improve Life" and know that it is often referred to as "Canada's Food University." Another Year - No Pension Indexation Increase

As all UofG pension recipients (should) know, our pension plan has some "cost-of-living" indexation provisions. The common description of this provision is "CPI-2%". What may be confusing to

some retirees is the current "headline" CPI percentage (3% as of July) which computes the difference between the most recent month and the index reading for that same month last year.

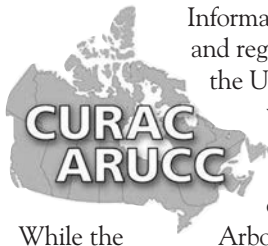
The actual calculation for UofG's plan is quite complex, and is based on the 12 month period from May 1 to April 30. The complexity arises from comparing

the **average** CPI for each month in the current fiscal year compared to the average index for the prior year. For the fiscal year ending April/18 the calculation equals 1.68% (verified with Human Resources), and therefore there is no indexation increase in our pensions this year.

Here are the full cost details, in Canadian dollars:

- \$5,779 per couple, or \$2,889.50 per person, based on double occupancy
- If traveling single, add \$1,050 for the single supplement
- \$180 per person for China Visa processing, to be arranged by Nexus
- \$210 per person for prepaid gratuities
- \$56.50 per person for booking administration fee

The above costs include:

- Return international airfares from Toronto/Vancouver, airport taxes, and transfers

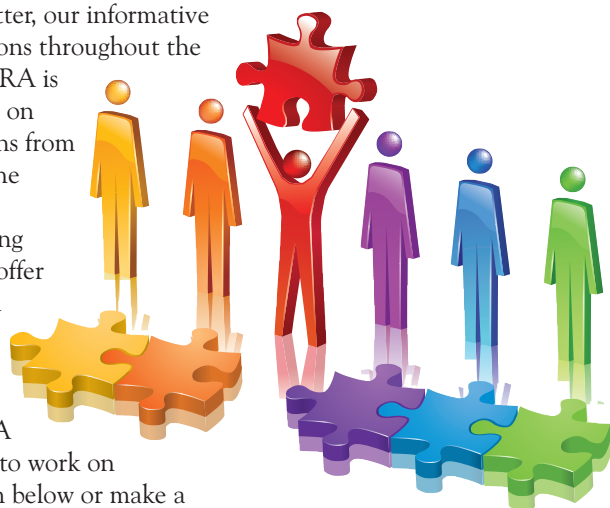
